### Dinner Money

For the parents who wish to pay dinner money for the next half term, the amount is £73.50. This is for the period Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February to Friday 11<sup>th</sup> April inclusive. If your child is in Year 1, they have a trip booked on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> March, so if they normally stay for lunch on that day, please deduct £2.10. The cost of a school lunch remains at £2.10 per day for the children who stay on a daily basis. Please make cheques payable to Staffordshire County Council and for those of you who wish to pay by Parent Pay and need further information about how to do this, please contact the school office. This is by far the easiest option as it allows you to put a lump sum onto your account. As and when your child has a school dinner, it is deducted. You can also set up an alert to make you aware when your account is running low.
