Thomas Russell Infant School is committed to equalities (treating people fairly) and strongly values diversity (people's differences).

This process will involve consultation with relevant key stakeholders, i.e. staff, students, parents and governors, and will be open minded in its approach. For all pupils, including all groups, to make consistently rapid and sustained <u>progress</u> through:

- The use of carefully planned teaching strategies, resources and interventions to support learners, ensuring that all children are at least secure in their learning, specifically disadvantaged children, boys in EY and SEN.

This will ensure that at Thomas Russell Infants' School ALL children are believed to be able to make equal progress and attain equally well as each other.
