School Funding—A message from the Chair of Governors

Hello to all parents and carers of Thomas Russell Infants' School from your Governing Board. I write to you in conjunction with the school's staffing arrangements you will have received today in your child's book bag. You will notice that we have found ourselves in the invidious position of having to reduce our overall levels of teacher support for the next academic year. The reason for this reduction is the Government's National Funding Formula that has seen a national decrease in funding to schools and educational establishments across the country. We find this an appalling state of affairs, especially as we are an oversubscribed school being encouraged to increase our pupil numbers (albeit as a temporary measure). Over the years, we have always been proud to have high levels of teacher support and we hope that the funding equilibrium will be returned as time goes on. The Governing Board, alongside the Co-Headteachers, Deputy Headteacher and Office Manager, deliberated tirelessly and have postponed other school refurbishment projects to allocate as much of the funding as is possible to teachers, teaching support and resources for your children. With the staff team we have at Thomas Russell Infants' School, I am sure you will agree that - even faced with obstacles - they will ensure that only the highest levels of teaching and learning experiences will continue as they have always done.
