This week we were delighted to receive feedback for the work our children did for the JTMAT Subject Excellence RE project. Our child wrote reflections about friendship and kindness for their entries.



Reminder—Get your DT thinking caps on and become a designer of the future!

As part of JTMAT Design Technology subject excellence, an exciting competition has been launched, giving your child the opportunity to get creative and design a product to 'make the world a better place', judged by the London Spy Studios Design Company . This idea can be as weird and wonderful as they wish, let your child's minds get creative!

Take a look at some of the examples below of 'blue sky thinking' products.

The can opener has been designed to help people with arthritis, it allows them to go about simple daily tasks like opening a can with ease. They would not be able to do this without this product being designed. <u>Weblink</u>.

No power, no problem. Pull the cord. Generate electricity. Never run out of power. NowLight turns your effort into electricity. A minute of pulling will generate up to 2 hours of light or enough power for a 15-minute phone call. NowLight can also be charged from USB power sources or using a solar panel. Weblink.

Adiff. A "jacket that can turn into a tent" (a.k.a. the trench & bomber), one of our first solution-based items designed to provide assistance to homeless and refugee populations. Weblink

Biscuit Pocket: The Cup That Holds Your Cookies. Perfect place to keep your biscuits safe and makes it easier to carry your cup of tea and biscuits to the sofa where you can relax.

Entries need to be on an A4 PowerPoint Slide saved as a PDF with your full name and school as the file name e.g. joe.smith_ThomasRussellInfantsSchool.

Make sure you answer the 3 questions fully. No more than 100 words per question.

- Who does your product help?
- How does it help them?
- Why is the product needed?

Include a visual representation of your idea (Maximum 3 images). These could be drawings or photographs of 3D models that you have made.


